AT, BY, FOR, FROM, IN, OF, OFF, ON, OUT, THROUGH, TILL, TO, UP, WITH.

About, above, across, along, among, amidst, amongst, around, before, behind, below, beneath, beside, between, beyond, inside, outside, underneath, within, without.

According to, along with, away from, because of, by dint of, by means of, by reason of, by virtue of, by way of, for the sake of, in accordance with, in addition to, in (on) behalf of, in case of, in comparison of, in consequence of, in course of, in favour of, in front of, in lieu of, in order to, in place of, in spite of, instead of, on account of, owing to, with a view to, with reference to, with regard to.

1. Use 'in' with SPACES (area). ^(with the names of streets)
• in a room / in a building / in a garden, in a park.

2. Use 'in' with bodies of water
• in the water ; in the sea, in a river

1. Use AT with 'places': (~~20~~ with ^{specific address} the name of street / House number)

- at the bus-stop ; at the door, at the cinema, at the end of the street.

2. Use 'at' with places on a page :-

- at the top of the page ; at the bottom of the page

3. Use 'at' to talk about group activities -

- at the party ; at the meeting.

4. specific Time - The train is due at 12.15 PM

ON

1. Use 'on' with surfaces :-

- on the ceiling / on the wall / on the floor / on the table

2. Use on with directions :-

- on the left / on the right

TILL

Till is used of time :-

He slept till eight o' clock.

'To' - is used of place :-

He walked to the end of the street.

WITH - often denotes the instrument
He killed two birds with one shot

'TO' — Place
use 'to' in order to express movement toward an
She's going to the dentist's office.

FOR :
use for when we measure time (seconds,
minutes, hours, days, months, years)
She's lived there for seven years.

By
we use 'by + noun' when we talk about
means of transport. We don't use 'the' or 'a/an' before the noun; as
we travelled by train (not by the/a train)
we say - by bicycle, by car/taxi/bus / by air

We use 'on' to mean a specific bicycles,
bus, train, ship/plane. And 'in' to mean a
specific car, taxi, van, ambulance.

Ram went there on my bike (not by my bike)
They came in a taxi
I'll go on the 7.30 bus

we say on foot (not by foot)
He goes to the office on foot.
